2022 – "QEH goes Gold" Celebrations on GCSE results day



During a summer of Commonwealth & European Games, QEH has succeeded in achieving its very own Gold with a set of outstanding exam results.

- Our top ten pupils once again performed spectacularly, achieving 110 A* or A grades between them.
- 25% of our pupils achieved at least 5 GCSEs at grade A* or A
- 78% of pupils achieved at least 5 GCSEs at A*-C
- 232 Year 11 pupils leave with a recognised qualification
- 64.2% of pupils achieved 5 GCSEs including English and Maths

These results were the product of external exams being held for the first time in two years since the pandemic. These results reflect the determination and commitment of our pupils as they have risen to meet the challenge, as well as the superb support offered by staff in helping pupils to achieve their goals.

More than ever, this year reflects our school motto; 'Ymlaen Gyda'n Gilydd/ Moving Forward Together' as pupils, parents and staff have worked exceptionally hard together to support our learners in receiving the outcomes they deserve.
