GCSE Examination Results

Fantastic Results and celebrations all around on GCSE results day

QEH Year 11's outcomes were a cause for celebration as we maintained our strong track record for success. Across Wales GCSE outcomes are down on last year as results move closer to pre-pandemic levels. QEH's strong performance at A*-C off-sets the well-publicised squeeze at the top end of GCSE results.



Year 11 have to be praised for their hard work and positive approach to their examinations as we returned to normal exams. The dedication and commitment of our staff ensured that pupils were well prepared and well motivated, in their approach to the exams. This team effort between pupils and staff is evident in these fantastic results. Well done everyone!

- 19% of our pupils achieved at least 5 GCSEs or equivalent at grade A* or A
- 74% of pupils achieved at least 5 GCSEs or equivalent at A*-C – significantly above the Welsh average
- 61.2% of pupils achieved 5 GCSEs or equivalent including English and Maths
- 97.7% A*-G or equivalent – above the average for Wales
- 100% of Year 11 pupils leave with a recognised qualification

There continues to be strong performance at all levels with pupils exceeding national averages in most indicators. Particularly pleasing is that, despite challenges, every pupil in Year 11 at QEH has left with a recognised qualification. We once again reflect the motto 'Ymlaen Gyda'n Gilydd' – 'Moving Forward Together'.
