End of Term & Online Learning

Wednesday evening saw us having to make the very difficult decision to return to online learning for the last three days of term. COVID impacted on key staff who are essential to the safe running of our school and the decision had to be made, in the interests of everyone's safety, to close the building.

This was not done lightly but with the full support of the county, Director of Education and Chair of Governors. What I can say with absolute certainty is that it was the right thing to do.

It is also fair to say that as a community we were disappointed. We had some fantastic plans for the end of term based around activities and wellbeing which we weren't able to complete. I would also like to take this opportunity to apologise to some pupils who didn't get access to their full diet of online learning. Due to the pace of events not all staff were able to access their laptops and resources for the immediate move to online learning.

Start of Term Arrangements January 2022

You will by now be aware following Welsh Government announcements and Director's letter on Friday that we will have a staggered start to next term. Tuesday January 4th and Wednesday January 5th have been designated as planning days to ensure the school is prepared operationally for the new term. A Hub will be operating for pupils in year 7 pupils whose parents are critical workers (see below).

- **Tuesday, January 4th – Planning and Preparation Day**
- **Wednesday, January 5th – Planning & preparation Day (Hub operating for critical workers)**
- **Thursday, January 6th – Years 10,11, 12 & 13 on site – Years 7,8 and 9 online learning (Hub operating for critical workers)**
- **Friday, January 7th - Years 10,11, 12 & 13 on site – Years 7,8 and 9 online learning (Hub operating for critical workers)**
- **Monday, January 10th – All pupils on site**

We will once again return to wearing of face coverings in all indoor areas and placing year groups in bubbles.

Our intention is to remain open to learners but to be prepared to return to effective online learning should the need arise. We also have made mitigations around exam arrangements for external and Year 12 and 13 Mock exams. We are determined at this stage to maintain this provision.

As always and regardless of the plans made our priority will be in keeping our learners and staff safe. We will keep you informed.

Lateral Flow Testing Increases to Three Times per week

You will see as part of the Director's letter that schools in Wales are asked to increase routine lateral flow testing to three times per week for those who take part. LFT testing is highly recommended to help reduce potential spread of all variants of the virus. We are also asked to take three tests in the second week of Christmas holidays, before we return to school. From January onwards, testing will take place on Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings commencing from Thursday 30th January.



During the holidays LFT kits can be sourced through local pharmacies or online via the NHS. Kits will also be available from reception in school when school re-opens in January.

It is also vitally important that results are recorded with the NHS.

As you are aware, the situation continues to change rapidly and Welsh Government and the Local Authority will continue to monitor the data carefully. There may be further updates that will have an impact on our return to school in January and we will keep you informed as soon as more information becomes available. Please check the school website over the holiday period and before the 5th January where the latest information will be published.
