- 21% of overall grades were A* compared to the national average of 17%
- 41% of overall grades were A*-A equal to the national average
- 86% of overall grades were A*-C
- 9 Subjects areas, including Maths, Chemistry, RS and History achieved 100% A*-C
- 100% of students left school with a recognised qualification
