#### **New Wellbeing Centre**

As part of our strategy of providing exceptional levels of wellbeing support alongside excellent academic provision, this summer will see the start of works on a new Wellbeing Centre at the school. This facility, planned to open in October, will replace the S01 provision with a state of the art facility that provides a bespoke set of offices, quiet areas and intervention classrooms. This will allow greater privacy and provide an opportunity for our wellbeing support team to work more closely together to deliver the levels of care and support our pupils deserve.

#### **QEH Sixth Form Centre – Phase 1**

Our aim as a school is to ensure we provide first-rate learning facilities for all our learners. As part of these plans, we have a plan to invest, refurbish and develop our QEH Sixth Form Centre. Phase 1 of that operation will take place over the summer and in the first term of the new academic year. They will include:

- Re-opening of the Sixth Form Café
- Refurbishment of the Common Room
- Provision of a bespoke study facility of the first floor
- A new wellbeing, counselling and study support area on the ground floor.

## **Development of Key Stage Offices and Additional Support Areas**

From September, we will be centralising our support for KS3 and 4 into two support areas. The Heads of Learning will for Key Stage 4; Mrs Nicole Thomas, Mrs Kirsty James and Miss Nia Davies will be based on in an office on D0 corridor. The Key Stage 3 Team, composed of Mrs Joy Ostendorff, Mrs Becki Williams and Mr Chris Patterson will be based together on G0 corridor. New admin staff appointed in September will support both Key Stage areas. We are confident that this will strengthen communication with parents, provide increased support for learners and allow us the opportunity to be pro-active in dealing with pastoral issues.

Alongside our new wellbeing provision, we are also investing in staff and facilities to provide improved levels of behaviour support for pupils at QEH. From September, a new, well-qualified team will work alongside teaching staff, the pastoral team in Key Stages 3 and 4, and the Wellbeing Team to provide pro-active, targeted interventions to ensure continuity of learning for all.

# **COVID Update**

After many weeks of falling numbers, there was, unfortunately, an increase in cases last week. This reminds us that it remains very important that we avoid complacency and continue to work together, for all of our protection. We appreciate your support and patience as things could still rapidly change going forward. We will always keep you informed as fully and as quickly as possible.

Our key mitigations are currently based around the following key factors and we would remind learners to maintain these as often as possible:

Distance	Handwashing
Self-isolation	Ventilation

#### **Updated Guidelines.**

#### Self-Isolation and Testing

Routine Lateral Flow Testing has now ended for schools and should only be taken by someone who has any of the classic symptoms: new or persistent cough, high temperature, change or loss to sense of smell and/or taste. Tests can be requested on the Welsh Government website or in pharmacies.

Anyone with symptoms should still isolate and take a LFT test. The guidance for schools remains the same in terms of isolation: anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 should isolate for at least five full days\*. The first full day of isolation is the day after the onset of symptoms or the day after a positive test.



- **Before** exiting self-isolation, a person should take <u>two</u> lateral flow device (LFD) tests 24 hours apart to check they are not still infectious.
- The first lateral flow test should be taken on DAY FIVE of isolation.
- They should **remain in isolation** until they have had **two consecutive negative LFT results 24 hours apart.**
- The earliest a person will be able to leave isolation would be on DAY SIX.

You do not need a negative test result on Day 10 to leave isolation.
