# Queen Elizabeth High School



Dear Parent/Carer,

As has been the case during the last year the situation remains fluid and changes and information continue to presented to us with very short notice. This week has proved no different. There have been two announcements this week which directly affect our school:

### Education Minister Kirsty Williams provides further clarity on system to replace exams for general qualifications in 2021

The Minister has confirmed her intention is for general qualifications in Wales to be supported by a three pillar approach made up of:

- non-examination assessments
- internal assessments
- · assessments that are externally set and marked

Education Minister Kirsty Williams said:

"I would like to thank Geraint Rees and the group of head teachers and college leaders for working at pace to develop these recommendations and for putting equity for learners at the centre of thinking.

What I am providing details of today is a transparent and rigorous approach to support learners as they progress to their next steps.

It ensures that universities can be confident of the abilities of students from Wales through their qualifications, and it also promotes teaching, learning and consistent assessment across Wales as we all struggle to recover in different ways from the impact coronavirus has had on education.

I was clear that any solution must be mindful of our learners' well-being. I am satisfied we have an approach that is fair for all learners whilst minimising disruption to learning and maintaining confidence and trust in the integrity of qualifications in Wales.

Alternative options would have required centres to design assessment materials, develop and test marking schemes, and then be responsible for appeals in relation to these.

This would take time away from teaching and learning and could also lead to inconsistency for learner experiences across Wales.

I am also confident these plans minimise the impact on teacher workload - teachers and lecturers are already under a great deal of pressure and we do not want to add to this.

This approach confirms that the internal assessments will not begin until after the spring half term, so schools can focus entirely on teaching until then. WJEC will provide further guidance and information in January."

### The arrangements for opening in January 2021

Wales enters a lockdown again on 28<sup>th</sup> December 2021. There have also been changes to the arrangements for re-opening secondary schools from January 2021. The term will begin for staff only on Monday 4th January with a staff INSET day as previously planned. Further planning days have now been added and the first week of term will focus on off-site blended learning for pupils with a staggered return to school from 11th January onwards. Please see the attached letter from the Director of Education.

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#### **Canolfan Elfed Arrangements**

- Week commencing 4th January- Planning days on 4th and 5th January- for the remainder of the week each pupil will be offered a full day each direct teaching in school, work will be posted on GC every other day when pupils will be working from home. Staff support will be available online.
- Week commencing 11th January- All pupils will be offered two full days direct teaching in school apart from our 6th form class who will be offered three days that week. GC work will be posted for the days where pupils will be working from home. Staff support will be available online.
- Week commencing 18th January-All pupils will be in school as usual for full days.

These are national changes brought in by the Welsh government with the anticipation that all pupils will be back in school for face to face learning by Monday 18th January.

## These arrangement may be subject to change as we receive further updates on health, from Welsh Government or changes in local circumstances.

We appreciate that there will be genuine uncertainty and anxiety around this since it depends upon infection rates following the Christmas period, the incidence of positive cases and the availability of staff to safely open schools. However, we will aim to make provision for pupils of critical workers and from 7th January. Details of how to access this provision will follow in the new year. Our school will be open to support vulnerable learners and families and to deliver on line learning from the 7th January 2021.
