Dear Parent/Carer,

So far we have been very pleased with the uniform, equipment and approach to school displayed by the pupils. These play an important part in returning to normal operating and I would like to thank you all for the support you have shown. Diolch yn fawr.

Covid-19

You will be aware that, like many schools in the county, we have seen confirmed cases of Covid-19 already this term. That is to be expected, as society moves towards managing and living with this virus. However, in order to mitigate its effects, it is important that we work together. I would therefore like to remind all parents and carers of the steps they need to take if a case is suspected or confirmed. The Local Authority will also be writing to parents and carers and we will publish that letter on our website.

- If a pupil is showing any of the 'classic' symptoms of Covid-19 (a high temperature, new and prolonged cough or loss of taste/smell, he or she should not attend school. Please book a PCR test.
- We encourage all pupils to take LFT tests twice a week. If a test is positive, please book a PCR test. Do not attend school unless the PCR test is negative. Please let us know that you have received a positive LFT test.
- If a PCR test for a pupil is positive, please let the school know by
 emailing office@qehs.carms.sch.uk with a screenshot of the test result. The TTP service
 will contact you directly, but the pupil should self-isolate and not attend school until the
 date given by the TTP service.
- If your child is a close contact of a positive case, even within you own family, there is no need to sel-isolate unless advised to by TTP. However, should you make a decision to self-isolate under those circumstances, we would support that decision.

Lateral Flow Testing

This is an increasingly important aspect of helping schools monitor infection and keeping covid out of school. You will have received a request from school for participation in the testing. Could I please encourage you to take school up on the offer of kits which will be provided free of charge from school on request. Pupils from Years 7 to 11 will need a parental permission note via Xpressions. Pupils in Years 12 and 13 can sign the consent form in school

Flu vaccine

- Your son or daughter will soon be bringing home information from Public Health Wales regarding a nasal spray flu vaccine. <u>Please note that this is not a Covid-19</u> <u>vaccination programme.</u>
- Involvement in the programme requires consent. Please read the information carefully and make your decisions based on the information provided.

Open evenings/parent and carer evenings

We are in discussions with other schools and with the Local Authority to
evaluate whether or not we can return to on-site events. In this context, we have
delayed planned Year 7, 10 and 12 evenings until we have received the recommended
guidance. At this stage, it looks more likely that we will need to use online platforms.

The school has undergone a rigorous risk assessment with the Local Authority.
