Centre Determined Grades (CDGs)

Provisional CDGs for WJEC qualifications will be released to learners via their Hwb email addresses on Sunday 13th June. It is essential that learners check their emails on Sunday. **All results will be issued by 12pm on Sunday afternoon.** Following the release of the results all learners will receive a letter via email outlining how the grades were arrived at, the processes involved and what to do if there is a query.

It is important to note that the grades issued on Sunday are provisional until they are moderated and published by the WJEC in August.

CDGs Year 13

Year 13 students should note that these provisional Centre Determined Grades (CDGs) will not be accepted by universities. Higher education institutions will only confirm your place based on the actual grades which you will receive on the A2 results day 10th August 2021.

CDGs Year 11

Year 11 students should note that these provisional Centre Determined Grades (CDGs) will not be accepted by further education colleges at this time. Colleges will will only confirm your place based on the actual grades which you will receive on the GCSE results day 12th August 2021.

The results being issued on Sunday are only WJEC Welsh examination board results.

KS3 National Testing

The annual Online National Tests for Key Stage Three (Reading and Numeracy) have taken place this week. Subject teachers will also use classroom assessments as part of normal

lessons to help ascertain a base level and inform teaching and learning so that we can best help each pupil. Further information will follow.

<u>Covid</u>

As most of you are aware we had to send Year 10 home from school this week in response to a possible Covid positive test. These decisions are never taken lightly and are made jointly in discussions with the LEA and TTP team. They are always made with the intention of keeping learners and staff safe. Keeping everyone safe will remain of paramount importance in any decision we make.

Fortunately, on this occasion a follow up, more accurate CPR test proved negative and learners were able to return to school. However, it does serve as a timely reminder that Covid, and its variants, is still in our community and has the potential to cause further disruption yet. I would ask all our community to continue to take reasonable precautions and follow the guidance issued by the Welsh Government and NHS.

Lateral Flow Testing

Lateral Flow Testing kits have been allocated to pupils in all year groups who wish to participate in the testing. Please note:

<u>Testing will move to Sundays and Wednesdays</u> from this Sunday 14th June 2020. In future, tests will need to be taken every Sunday and Wednesday evenings after 6.00pm.

- LFTs must be used regularly on the established twice-weekly regime. Ad hoc tests taken out this sequence are not reliable.
- All results MUST reported into the NHS portal once the test is taken. This is essential in the event of a positive result.
- LFTs must not be used if experiencing any of the main 3 covid symptoms. In this case you should go straight away for a PCR test.
- Parents will receive a message via the Xpressions app to report results to school. There is also a need to report results to the NHS via a Welsh Government link.
- LFT tests are an additional layer of support and DO NOT replace PCR tests. Anyone with symptoms must isolate and book a PCR test.
- Please do not take the test if you have symptoms or have tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 90 days
- If the result is positive, please let the school know immediately. Everyone in the household should isolate and you should book a PCR test by calling 119 or using the online portal <u>https://gov.wales/apply-coronavirus-test</u>

Test kits cannot be allocated before parental consent is received.

B) <u>TTP</u>

Whilst COVID infection rates continue to fall, it still remains important to contact the school if your child receives a positive test result. Please email us on either <u>Office@qehs.carms.sch.uk</u> to let us know if your child has symptoms, a positive test or needs to isolate.

If your child has any of the symptoms of COVID then please book a test via the Welsh Government website and inform the school and Delta Wellbeing by email on: TTP@deltawellbeing.org.uk or by telephone on 0300 333 2222

Please note – lateral flow tests are not to be taken if your child has symptoms of COVID and should be replaced by a PCR test.

All information is treated confidentially and allows us to plan for pupils' safe return.

If your child is identified as a contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, they will need to self-isolate at home for 10 days. This means they can't leave the house; they can't go the shops or exercise anywhere outside your home/garden, and they can't have any visitors to your home/garden. Everyone else in the household can continue as normal in line with the firebreak regulations. However, if your child becomes symptomatic, the whole household would then need to self-isolate.
