Queen Elizabeth's High School (QEH) is delighted to celebrate another year of exceptional AS and A Level results, reflecting the dedication, resilience, and hard work of its students.

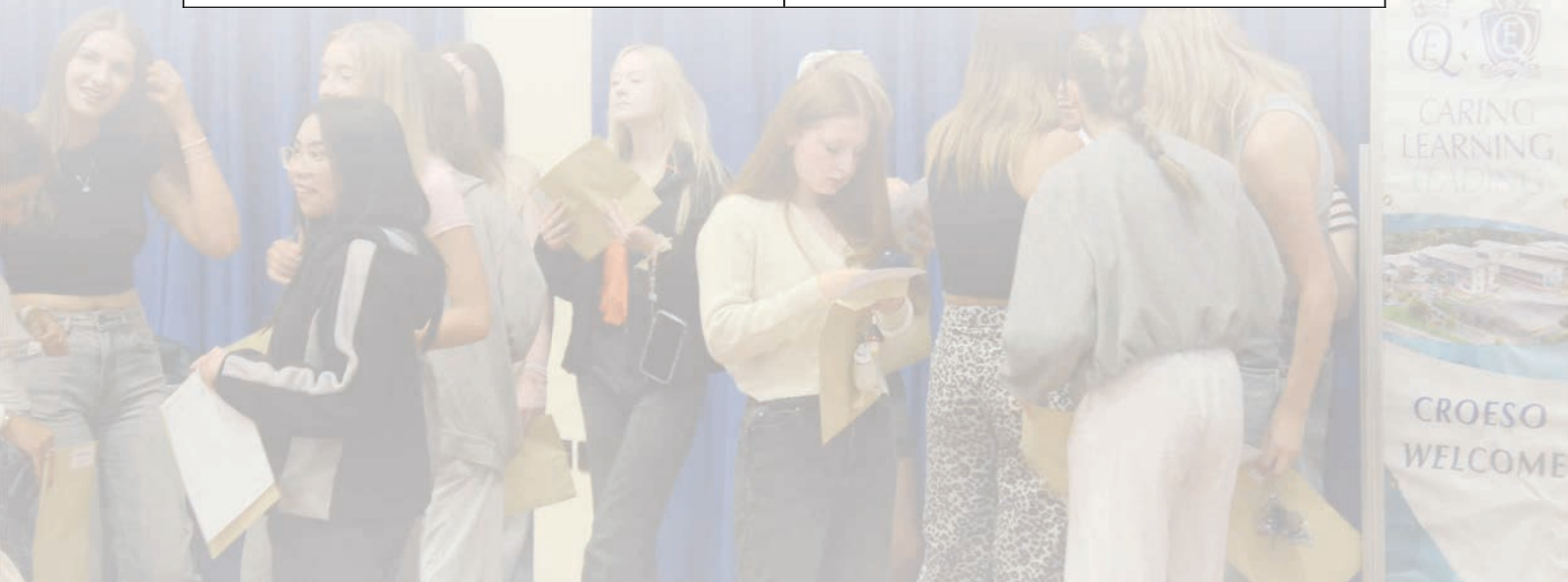
This year, QEH students have achieved outstanding academic outcomes, with many securing top grades and gaining places at prestigious universities and programs. At A level, 32% of students achieved A* to A, above the national average for Wales, 78% A* to C with 96% achieving A* to E.



At AS Level (Year 12), a quarter of all grades were A grades. AS outcomes matched our best ever AS results and this bodes well for next year! These results are a testament not only to the students' determination but also to the unwavering support provided by QEH's teaching staff, who guide, challenge, and inspire learners every step of the way.
