
Dear Parent/Carer,

Important Information

Promoting Positive Behaviour;

- "Our behaviour affects everyone and everything"
- Vapes Last term there were several concerns raised about vaping.

 Following a series of assemblies we have implemented spot checks and bag searches on any individuals identified as using or providing vapes in schools. We intend to maintain this policy of spot check and bag searches this term. Pupils and students found in possession of vapes will receive appropriate sanctions.
- Mobile Phones We will continue to consult with parents and the pupil body around mobile phone use. However, research that the school has been involved with at a county level has identified some significant concerns around constant mobile phone use, misuse of mobile phones and the negative impacts of social media. Whilst we are aware of some of the benefits that mobile phones bring we are increasingly concerned about their misuse and the detrimental impact they can have on health and wellbeing. As an interim measure and to tie in with exams, (When mobile phone use is prohibited by exam procedures) we will be prohibiting the use of mobile phones in school from May Half Term. Pupils can bring their phones to school, but will be expected to turn them off before entering the building. Pupils will not be allowed to use their phones during the school day. Pupils found using a phone without the express permission of a member of staff will have the phone confiscated and returned at the end of the school day. Persistent unauthorised use of a mobile phone will lead to sanctions.
- **Uniform** Can parents/carers ensure that when your child returns to school after the Easter holidays that they are wearing a full school uniform.
- > **Uniform**: shirt, tie, school jumper or the approved ¼ zip top. Black school trousers (No leggings, jeans, cargo/combat trousers or jogging bottoms) or skirt (which is to be of a suitable and modest length) with thick black tights (with no socks over them). Black shoes are to be worn. No outer clothing is allowed in classrooms. Hoodies are not permitted. Pupils are permitted to wear a watch, one ring and small stud earrings, no facial piercings are allowed.

Regular uniform checks will be conducted to ensure that pupils are conforming to the rules on uniform.
