#### <u>Covid</u>

There has been further disruption at the end of term as regards Covid, and its variants. The virus is still present in our community and has the potential to cause further disruption. I would ask all our community to continue to take reasonable precautions and follow the guidance issued by the Welsh Government and NHS.

<u>There will be no testing taking place over the summer holidays.</u> However, on our return, it is essential that pupils adhere to the days allocated for lateral flow tests (Sunday and Wednesday evenings). <u>If your child presents with symptoms then please do not use the lateral flow test but book a PCR test using the information and contact details below.</u>

#### AS/A2 and GCSE Results Days

**Tuesday August 10<sup>th</sup> 2021 A2 and AS Results Day**. Students in Years 12 and 13 can pick up their results from 9:00am that morning in the Performance Hall. Covid safe restrictions are in place with a separate entrance and exit.

**Thursday August 12<sup>th</sup> 2021 GCSE Results Day**. Year 11 pupils will be able to pick results up from 9:00am in the morning and Year 10 English Literature pupils can pick their results from 10:00am. Covid safe restrictions are in place with a separate entrance and exit.

**Sixth Form Enrolment**. This will take place on Thursday August 12<sup>th</sup> following receipt of GCSE results. The enrolment team will be based in the Sixth Form Block to help guide and support students in their choices of courses at Post 16. Covid safe restrictions are in place with a separate entrance and exit.

#### Arrangements for the Start of Term

#### Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> September - INSET DAY

#### Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September:

- Term begins for **Year 7** pupils, who are welcomed to QEH by Mr Dave Williams, Headteacher, and their Head of Learning Mrs Joy Ostendorff and by their Form Tutors. Pupils will be given their timetable and will begin to follow this during the day.
- Year 10 and year 12 learners return to school engaging with their individual option timetable.
- COVID safe behaviours will be outlined and reinforced for all.

#### Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September:

- All pupils return to school and will follow their timetables for the year
- COVID safe behaviours will be outlined and reinforced for all.

A reminder that all Year 7s will have to bring packed lunch for the first two days back in school and until they are registered on our systems. All other year groups will be able to purchase lunch form the canteen/cafe as normal.

Many thanks to all parents and guardians for supporting the transition arrangements in place. We look forward, collectively to a productive and positive year ahead.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

A letter will be going out to all parents next week outlining the requirements for uniform from September. School uniform is compulsory, as we believe that a neat and tidy appearance is a source of pride and identification and encourages sensible behaviour. Specific information will be included in the letter, however the basic principles and standards remain:

- All garments should be clearly marked with the owner's name.
- Denim jackets or jeans are not allowed under any circumstances.

- No jewellery may be worn in School, except for one pair of stud earrings in the lower lobe of the ear.
- External coats other than QEH tops must be removed in the building.
- Hair all hair styles must be reasonable and acceptable. Hair dyes and colours must be natural. Extreme hair styles are not allowed.
- Make up should be discrete and nail varnish unobtrusive.

Failure to conform with school uniform rules could result in a pupil being excluded from classes or sent home.

#### Important Safety Notice

Pupils should refrain from climbing on or attempting to climb over fences in school. If a ball is kicked over a fence then pupils should approach the caretaking staff to ask for help recovering it. **Under no circumstances should a pupil attempt to climb a fence**. There have been several serious accidents across Carmarthenshire schools in the past months as a result of accidents while climbing fences. We would ask parents to remind pupils to be sensible and reinforce the messages here.

# B) <u>TTP</u>

Whilst COVID infection rates continue to fall, it still remains important to contact the school if your child receives a positive test result. Please email us on either <u>Office@qehs.carms.sch.uk</u> to let us know if your child has symptoms, a positive test or needs to isolate.

#### If your child has any of the symptoms of COVID then please book a test via the Welsh Government website and inform the school and Delta Wellbeing by email on: TTP@deltawellbeing.org.uk or by telephone on 0300 333 2222

Please note – lateral flow tests are not to be taken if your child has symptoms of COVID and should be replaced by a PCR test.

All information is treated confidentially and allows us to plan for pupils' safe return.

If your child is identified as a contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, they will need to self-isolate at home for 10 days. This means they can't leave the house; they can't go the shops or exercise anywhere outside your home/garden, and they can't have any visitors to your home/garden. Everyone else in the household can continue as normal in line with the firebreak regulations. However, if your child becomes symptomatic, the whole household would then need to self-isolate.
